

#### Media & Political Literacy Programme.



The Plantation communities has been advocating for land rights as part of their broader demands for equal rights. Over the past few




years, the movement has gained momentum, with various activists, NGOs, and CSOs joining in support. CDF also taking in part of Island wide movement as one the network

#### Our organizational Structure and Partners










